The sidewalk on the north side is Industrial area, often obstructed with vehicles, etc. The sidewalk on the North side is NOT "standard" at all.

Due to difficulties of walking on the north sidewalk, most people just walked on the old boulevard on the south side, it was a muddy path, but preferable to the north side obstacle course.

Since Staff does not consider a sidewalk on the south side to be a priority, then we are left with a muddy path again. This will be formed by people walking on the "new" boulevard. The Shaw Project provided an excellent opportunity for a very economical sidewalk on top of the ditch.

The result of the current decision is that we will have our muddy path on the south side, rather than a gravel path. Interesting that Staff thought this was a good decision.
