Dear Mayor and Council,

I'm writing you on behalf of the Esquimalt Local Committee of Capital Bike in support of the Active Transportation Network Plan (ATNP), but we are asking Council to think bolder. We need faster action to get All Ages and Abilities (AAA) bikeways built in less than 5 years. A "quick build" that doesn't allow cyclists of all ages and abilities to use it will fail to enable Esquimalt to meaningfully reduce transportation emissions in the Township.

The ATNP is a key "Big Move" in <u>Esquimalt's Community Climate Mitigation Plan Draft</u>, and with the fires and flooding B.C. experienced in 2021 it is clear that bold climate action is needed now. We support the approval of the ATNP but recommend that:

- 1. Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Roads be built to true AAA standards by the end of 2024;
- All short-term actions in the ATNP be completed by 2025; and,
- 3. The Ultimate Network be completed by 2030.

At the February 7th Council meeting, we ask that you direct Staff to:

Report back to Council within 30 days on an action plan that:

- Requests early 2022 budget approval for the full design of the Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Road "spine" corridor routes.
- Includes a budget and schedule to have the Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Road bikeways complete by the end of 2024 or earlier.
- Ensures Esquimalt applies for the federal Active Transportation Fund (deadline March 31, 2022) and the provincial Active Transportation Grant (call anticipated to open Spring 2022) to maximize the potential for senior government funding for capital projects.
- Outlines the resource implications of an amended timeline for completion of all short-term ATNP actions by 2025 and the Ultimate Network by 2030.

In both the short and the long term, we also ask Council to ensure that Esquimalt has the staffing resources required to plan and execute the ATNP and to maximize opportunities for grant funding.

# <u>Appendix I – Esquimalt Climate Change Commitments and Draft Climate Change Mitigation Plan</u> Direction

- April 12, 2019 Esquimalt joined more than 20 communities in B.C. and more than 1,700 communities around the world by declaring a climate emergency.
  - Includes "THAT the Township move as quickly as possible to create and implement a climate action plan and climate adaptation plan as per the draft 2019-2023 Strategic Plan"
- November 25, 2019 Council unanimously endorsed the proposed target to reduce corporate emissions by 45 per cent and committed Esquimalt to becoming a 100 per cent renewable energy community by 2050.
- <u>Esquimalt's Community Climate Mitigation Plan Draft</u> (April 2021) proposes that Esquimalt's community greenhouse gas emissions be reduced by 38% from 2007 levels by 2030
  - One of "The Big Moves" is to "Shift Beyond the Car" and to encourage active & accessible transportation and transit.

Subject: Active Transport Plan - Please Accelerate

My family relocated to the Capital Region last fall for my partner's work (she's a ). We do not own a car, and cycle or walk everywhere we want to go. We rent our home short-term right now and are looking for a permanent family home in the next 2-3 years. For us to consider living in Esquimalt, we would need to see rapid development of a bike network that's safe for our kids to use.

It's been interesting seeing the approaches taken by different municipalities here on the Island. We see the right steps being taken in Victoria, no steps being taken in Oak Bay, and a little bit of progress being made in Saanich. Esquimalt seems to have all the ingredients with the incredible Goose and E&N trails available, getting from the trails to destinations (or perhaps our new home?!) is essential for us to visit or choose to live in a place.

This said, please approve the plan that's in front of you tomorrow, and find any way to accelerate it to be built THIS YEAR, which is what Canadian urbanist Brent Toderian recommends every city do with its active transportation plan as the "most important thing your city can be doing right now." Every route should be built to be comfortable for an eight year old to safely navigate, and wide enough for families to ride side-by-side, or allowing someone to use a bicycle to pass someone on a mobility scooter. Canadian authors and bike design experts Chris and Melissa Bruntlett will put it this way: width is everything when it comes to bikeways.

I've been engaged in "bikes as transportation" space for more than a decade now, and am happy to offer free support, understanding, or education to any decision maker who wants to better understand the needs of transportation cyclists. Heck, I've built a career out of it once, and now I want to have my family be safe while riding together, too. Don't hesitate to reach out.

Thanks for supporting our car-free family, please vote in support of the new Active Travel plan tomorrow.

Dear Mayor Desjardin and Esquimalt Council members,

Today was a beautiful sunny day in Esquimalt, the sort of February weather that makes all my relatives in other parts of Canada feel jealous.

My family spent the afternoon on our sunny driveway, getting our bicycles ready for spring. We put cleaned panniers on one of the longtail cargo bikes, raised the seats of the kids' bikes to accommodate growing legs, oiled chains, fixed a flat, and posted a spare kids bike as a gift on the local Buy Nothing Group. When I moved here as a university student 20 years ago, this was one of the main reasons why I chose to live in Greater Victoria: I wanted to live in a climate where I could easily ride my bicycle all year round. And then years later, when I was lucky enough to be able to buy a house, I chose to stay in Esquimalt. After renting here for years, I knew this was a community with all the amenities and neighbourly warmth I wanted for both myself and my children.

After working on our bikes all afternoon, and riding up and down on the sidewalk, my spouse took the kids to the pool at the Esquimalt Recreation Centre... But drove our car. Too often, this is the choice we make when visiting many of our favourite places in Esquimalt: Gorge Park, Saxe Point, Fleming Beach, Bullen Park, Esquimalt Bake Shop, the Library, the West Bay Walkway. Why? Because despite us loving our bikes, there simply are not safe and accessible north-south cycling corridors in our municipality.

With that context in mind, I would like you to please examine your choices for the Active Transportation Network Plan. We need to make sure that young children like mine are able to experience safe and accessible bicycle routes from this impressionable age, so that when they are older, they can confidently choose this low-emission transportation option as one that is normal and viable, and just part of the joys of urban life.

I urge you to consider implementing true all ages and all abilities standards to the bike lanes in Esquimalt as soon as possible, and certainly within your current council term. It needs to be a priority, for the sake of our community: More people cycling and walking is better for our local businesses,

makes our streets quieter, contributes less to air pollution, and increases our ability to connect as neighbours. I am proud to live and work in Esquimalt, and want what's best for all of us.

I am a senior and new resident in Esquimalt. My wife and I walk and cycle for shopping, errands and just getting to places. The thing that attracts us to Esquimalt the most is its human scale with amenities within walking and cycling distance.

Our preschool grandchildren are also in Esquimalt. We look forward to cycling with our grandchildren on safe All Ages All Abilities (AAA) protected cycle ways in a few years by which time we will be in our seventies.

A ten to fifteen year implementation as proposed in the ATNP is much much too slow. Our preschool grandchildren would be finishing high school by then! The climate cannot afford another generation of children being driven to school. Drivers will also thank-you for getting bicycles off the road and onto controlled bike-ways. As we increase our population through densification our roads are no longer safe enough for cycling and walking. The children and Esquimalt families of all ages will thank-you for building a safe AAA cycling network and doing it quickly.

Dear Mayor Desjardin and Esquimalt Council Members, I was pleased to see the proposed Active Transportation Network Plan for our community.

I appreciated seeing "age-friendly" and "accessible" as two of the guiding principles. At one side of the spectrum, we have people like our 2 kids , who are eagerly biking at a young age. At the other end of the spectrum, we have people like my neighbor, who has recently started biking after a 20year hiatus, so that she can enjoy riding with her husband. It is inspiring to see people of all ages and abilities enjoying biking for the sheer fun of it, but also for the practical, health, and environmental benefits it offers.

I am glad to see that the North-South corridor was prioritized, as I find Lampson/Tillicum one of the most challenging roads to ride on in the Capital Region. Although I occasionally do bike along Tillicum Road, I usually try to choose other farther-away stores (i.e. go to a different London Drugs or Fairway), so that I don't have to ride along this busy, fast, and unprotected road. When we are riding with our kids, I will only entertain the idea of our eyear-old riding with us if my husband is also riding (one adult at the front, one at the back). Our older son absolutely loves bike commuting with us, but this North-South corridor is an uncomfortable and sometimes scary experience for our family.

I really look forward to seeing improvements to this corridor. However, based on the guiding principles, I would highly encourage you to consider implementing bikes lanes to All Ages and Abilities standards in Esquimalt as soon as possible, ideally by 2024.

Time is of the essence, and I think it is important to call out specific deadlines for accomplishing this plan. My dream would be to have all short-term actions completed by 2026 and the Ultimate Network completed by 2030.

Planning needs to take into account the youth of today, many of whom don't want the expense or responsibility of owning a vehicle. We are building the future they will inherit now.



My name is Adrian Mohareb. I am a Vic West resident, and I am an extremely regular visitor of Esquimalt. My son attends school at MacAulay Elementary, we frequent the farmer's market and businesses in Esquimalt, we use the recreation facilities regularly (skating and swimming lessons, for example). We try to do many of these trips by bicycle; we have even bought a cargo bike to carry our son to school, to be one less car idling and clogging up the drop off area and the roads. However, this is not a very safe way to get around, since the bicycling infrastructure in Esquimalt is virtually non-existent, particularly to the destinations we go to. We use the E&N often, but there is probably only one semi-regular destination (Wholesale Club) even close to being accessible with our child on the E&N.

And so, I'm writing in support of the Active Transportation Network Plan (ATNP), but I am also asking Council to be more bold than what is in the plan. Faster action is needed to get All Ages and Abilities (AAA) bikeways built in less than 5 years. A "quick build" that doesn't allow cyclists of all ages and abilities, including my son, to use it, will fail to enable Esquimalt to meaningfully reduce transportation emissions in the Township. Currently, 31% of parents take their children to MacAulay by car; this number could be dramatically reduced (only 12% said they would choose to take their child by car if the alternatives were better) by making the routes to the school safer for active transportation.

The ATNP is a key "Big Move" in <u>Esquimalt's Community Climate Mitigation Plan Draft</u>, and with the fires and flooding B.C. experienced in 2021, it is clear that bold climate action is needed immediately. While I support the approval of the ATNP, I also recommend that:

- Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Roads be built to true AAA standards by the end of 2024;
- All short-term actions in the ATNP be completed by 2025; and
- The Ultimate Network be completed by 2030, with active transportation corridors connecting directly to every school in the Township.

At the February 7th Council meeting, I request that you direct Staff to:

- Report back to Council within 30 days on an action plan that: Requests early 2022 budget approval for the full design of the Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Road "spine" corridor routes;
- Includes a budget and schedule to have the Tillicum/Lampson and Esquimalt Road bikeways complete by the end of 2024 or earlier;
- Ensures Esquimalt applies for the federal Active Transportation Fund (deadline March 31, 2022) and the provincial Active Transportation Grant (call anticipated to open Spring 2022) to maximize the potential for senior government funding for capital projects; and
- Outlines the resource implications of an amended timeline for completion of all short-term ATNP actions by 2025 and the Ultimate Network by 2030.

In both the short and the long term, I also request Council ensure that Esquimalt has the staffing resources and budget required to plan and execute the ATNP and to maximize opportunities for grant funding.
