Completed energy efficiency retrofits at the Archie Browning Sports Centre which included: new roof with an insulation of R-18; installation of variable frequency drivers on the refrigeration plant; modifications to the air handling units; addition of direct digital control system (DCC) to control the air handling units and refrigeration plant; and upgrading of lighting systems and controls.
